Istanbul Greek	Ongoing project documenting the linguistic structure of Istanbul Greek and connecting variation to social differentiation via acoustic, discourse and multimodal analyses and guise experimentation.
Rhode Island English	Documenting English spoken in Rhode Island, an understudied variety in between Boston and New York City that has features of both present.
Hypercorrect Housewives	Studying the exponence of hypercorrected English coordinated pronouns in <i>The Real Housewives</i> using television corpus and stancetaking analysis.
Spanish Diminutives	Examining the sociopragmatic functions of and ideologies surrounding diminutives in Spanish varieties with surveys and discourse analysis.
Ethnonyms in Minoritized Contexts	Discourse analysis of how minoritized speakers navigate ethnic labeling in contexts such as stateless nations (Assyrians/Arameans) or panethnic affiliation (Hellenes/Romans or Latinx/Hispanic) and how linguistic variation is mapped onto such labels.
